# 3. International Students Safety Protocol - What to do in case of emergency.

#### 1. Remain Calm

Identify the TYPE OF EMERGENCY you are experiencing:

- Personal: illness, accident, injury, arrest, etc
- Regional: natural disaster, terrorist attack, political uprising, etc.

#### 2. Take Action

#### Personal:

- Put yourself in a safe place.
- Call 112
- Contact the EUSA Emergency Phone

#### Regional:

- **Put yourself in a safe place**: In most emergencies the safest place will be your accommodation.
- Wait for instructions: Use radio, TV and internet to gather information and share it with others. Follow instructions from authorities at all times.
  - Periodically check your email and keep your phone on. EUSA staff will contact you for further indications.

<sup>\*</sup> In the given case of a global emergency be conscious of your resources and try to use all of them persistently: email, social networks, emergency phones, etc.
