### 3. International Students Safety Protocol - What to do in case of emergency.

#### 1. Remain Calm

Identify the **TYPE OF EMERGENCY** you are experiencing:

- **Personal:** illness, accident, injury, arrest, etc
- **Regional:** natural disaster, terrorist attack, political uprising, etc.

\* In the given case of a global emergency, be conscious of your resources and try to use all of them persistently: email, social networks, emergency phones, etc.

#### 2. Take Action

**Personal:**

- **Put yourself in a safe place.**
- **Call 112**
- **Contact the EUSA Emergency Line\*** (ONLY if you have this service included in your programme)

**Regional:**

- **Put yourself in a safe place:** In most emergencies the safest place will be your accommodation.
- **Wait for instructions:** Use radio, TV and internet to gather information and share it with others. Follow instructions from authorities at all times.  
**Periodically check your email and keep your phone on.** EUSA staff may contact you with further indications.
